

The old saying you can tell a happy motorcycle tourer by the number of bugs in his teeth, just doesn't tell the whole story. There are many more important reasons we enjoy this type of transportation. The most important to me is the sense of freedom we have on our bike. While on the back roads you feel much closer to good old Mother Nature. Back roads are easily identified. When you ride by a herd of cattle and they stop grazing and stare at you then you have found a good back road. This is where you see the best of Mother Nature.

Just last weekend on one of the back roads we came across a raccoon. He was sitting in the middle of the road wondering what we were doing in his neighborhood. He didn't move one inch except to give us a dirty look as we rumbled by. In the next quarter of a mile we serpentined around a four foot black serpent. Within another quarter of a mile we watched two deer bound and leap into a forest. Around every curve, on top of each hill, and down in every valley there was something new to see.

The few people you pass will almost always wave. The farmer in the field, the children in their yards, and the mother hanging out her wash. And, should you need help, they are truly friendly and helpful.

When you're on a tour, get off the main highways and secondary highways, look for the "back roads". You will enjoy your trip even more.

Spring is about to spring!

Spring is almost here, less than two weeks away. Time to get your bikes ready. If you're due, make that appointment to get your mount serviced, buy those new tires or install those accessories everyone bought you for Christmas. It's that time to get ready for the upcoming riding season, time to put all your carry-along riding and emergency gear back in your trunk & side bags, and it's also time for you to look at the JPC event calendar and decide which of the many great rides you plan to attend.

My Maintenance Progress:

My bike is still sitting in the corner of my garage half torn apart. I have changed my air filter (for the first time, it really looked like it needed it), re-torqued the steering bearings (they did show some signs of being loose), installed a set of Kuryakyn Handlebar Risers and have installed the replacement heated grips (wiring is still in the works). This week I hope to complete the remaining tasks: Finish wiring the new heated grips, bleed & flush the hydraulics, change the coolant, check every nut & bolt for proper tightness and give the bike and tires a complete visual inspection. Also, I added another item to the list, I purchased HID low-beam headlights which I will install before I take "her" out on my first Spring ride.
